Welcome to Miss Chamoun's Language Arts/Social Studies classroom, where we are "Wild About Learning." As a team, we will be working together to create reading and writing goals while learning about ancient civilizations through essential questions. It is my goal to help your child achieve his/her own goals, and encourage him/her to discover the world through reading and writing.

For the 2014-15 school year, there is a lot to accomplish! The 6th graders are going to be learning about three main units: Belonging, Building, and Legacy. They will kick start the busy year learning about what it means to belong. Students will be researching ancient civilizations, such as Greece, Rome, Egypt and the Middle Ages, as well as reading and writing various fiction and nonfiction pieces, while focusing on the following essential questions: What does it mean to belong to a group, community, and/or family? How does identity contribute to the sense of belonging? How do challenges in environment, experience, geography, economy, etc. influence identity and belonging?

With the implementation of the new national standards, The Common Core, it is my hope to provide rigorous, yet nurturing activities and discussions that will foster students' strengthens and build upon their weaknesses. Furthermore, through my background in differentiation, I hope to continue to individualize instruction, based on data collected throughout each unit, in order to assist students in achieving success at his/her own level.
