Further, students have been learning more about analytical and argumentative paragraph writing using the box format. This coming month, students will be revising their Independent Reading Goals with Mrs. Marut or with me. Additionally, they will be reading their first novel in class, Freak the Mighty, and learning about close reading/annotation strategies to further investigate the essential question about belonging. It is my hope students learn not only about the theme and purpose of studying literature, but they learn about how characters are portrayed, as the novel will serve as a mentor text during our fiction/narrative writer's workshop near the end of the month.
